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Unlike other solutions that conduct passive scans of the wireless network, Elcomsoft Wireless Security Auditor can verify if any installed wireless access points are listening to any network traffic. Auditor will scan the wireless network and display any potential security issues the wireless network is vulnerable to. How to use Elcomsoft Wireless Security Auditor Elcomsoft Wireless Security Auditor is a two-part product, the first part is Elcomsoft Wireless Security Auditor, it consists of a stand-alone console application and a driver, which can be downloaded from Elcomsoft website. The second part of the product is a programming language, which can be used to develop auditing applications. The programming language is called EAS. The stand-alone part of the product has very intuitive interface. Elcomsoft Wireless Security Auditor can identify access points that are listening for any network traffic, and can display the list of access points that have been found to be listening. It can also identify all wireless client device connected to these access points. Auditor has some useful features. It allows the user to display the list of all wireless devices currently connected to the wireless access point. The user can select an access point and view detailed information about it such as MAC address and security settings of the access point. For example, the user can determine if the access point is an open access point that is listening for all wireless traffic or if the access point is a managed access point that can only receive traffic from defined clients. EAS programming language allows the user to develop auditing applications. All information gathered by Auditor can be processed in this way. Supported OS The stand-alone part of the product runs on Windows, Windows Server 2003 and later versions and Macintosh OS X, Linux, and BSD operating systems. In macOS Security issues On August 4, 2017, Microsoft published a security advisory which stated that Elcomsoft Wireless Security Auditor and other previous versions of the Elcomsoft wireless management software may be vulnerable to a man-in-the-middle attack. The vulnerability affects all older versions of Elcomsoft wireless management software, including version 7.5, which was released in January 2014, but does not affect the version 10.3.
